7. Using “A-to-Z” to go directly to websites like ScienceDirect, and for checking e-access to journal titles

As well as checking our e-access to journal titles as described above, you can also use the A-to-Z list to access publishers’ platforms/native interfaces directly. Your login information will be carried from Discover so you won’t have to log in again at the native interface.

For checking e-access to journal titles, use the Titles tab:
